Every page in this webtext has contextual information attached to it in the head of the html. This information includes the author of the text, the title of the page, the language and characters used, and instructions for viewing that page. This information not only provides context for someone who is navigating without visual cues, it also gives assistive devices a reference point for properly reading the text.
