## Accessibility Highlight Video: Permanence

Visual description: This video shows the "References" page in the "Identity and Representation" webtext. The narrator highlights one of the citations while describing how each web citation includes a date when the material was last accessed.

Transcript: In this final video, I am going to discuss permanence and accessibility. I've placed this video on my references page because this is the place where I've documented my source material, including web sites like the Disability March which sometimes disappear or morph as time passes. Because of this, I've made the choice to include images of protestors throughout my webtext rather than merely linking to those images. I've also included the dates for each of these entries to show when I last accessed any given source. The goal throughout has been to provide information that is as persistent and clear as possible for someone following the trail of my research. This is a measure that falls under the heading of "best practice for everybody but also good for accessibility."
